Why do we offer a K5 program?

Every child is special and unique in their own way. Even though the State of Indiana may say that a child is eligible for kindergarten, not every student is ready for kindergarten. We want to give our parents and the school options to provide a more successful first step in school and better prepare our students for the next level.

What are the age requirements for K5?

K5 is specifically for those students who are "young 5s". Young 5s are those who turn 5 after February 1st and before Sept. 1st. However, K5 is an option for all students entering Kindergarten.

Students must be 5 by Aug. 1st to enter regular Kindergarten.

What is the difference between the K5 and Kindergarten curriculum?

The K5 program is based on Indiana State Standards, with an emphasis on oral language development, literacy immersion, number sense, and collaborative experiences that encourage cooperation, self-confidence, self-regulation, and healthy attitudes about school and learning.

While still based on state standards and using a research-based curriculum, the curriculum is different from Kindergarten classes and does not move as quickly. The learning is rich in hands-on activities that include project-based learning and STEAM activities.

Will students be able to go to first-grade from the K5 classroom?

The program is not designed to transition a student into the first-grade classroom. If a child seems to be progressing academically, socially, and emotionally at a more advanced level, the parents may request a meeting with teachers and administrators to discuss placement and readiness for first grade. Kindergarteners must be able to show proficiency on weekly common formative assessments which are based on Indiana State Standards, quarterly benchmark assessments, and kindergarten report card measures.



K5 vs Kindergarten

A Snapshot of Skills Learned by the End of School Year

K5 END OF YEAR

Students will be able to...

- recognize and name MOST of the uppercase and lowercase letters
- recognize and say MOST letter sounds
- exposed to 20 sight words
- compare, add, subtract numbers
 1-10
- identify and give examples of 2 D shapes (circle, triangle, etc.)
- complete simple patterns independently
- use drawings to answer prompts or tell stories
- write uppercase and lowercase letters with a MODEL
- identify and write their name independently
- identify rhyming words

The K5 program is not designed to replace Kindergarten, it is designed to precede it.

Kindergarten END OF YEAR

Students will be able to...

- know ALL of the uppercase and lowercase letters
- know ALL letter sounds
- exposed to 75 sight words
- learn blends and digraphs
- blend sounds to read 3 & 4 letter words
- write short sentences using sight words and inventive spelling
- write uppercase and lowercase letters without a model
- spell CVC words and sight words
- learn numbers 1 20 emphasizing teen numbers
- add and subtract numbers to 10 in number sentences and word problems
- identify and give examples of 2 D & 3
 D shapes
- independently work and sit for a lesson for at least 20 minutes
